

Academic Core Dual Credit Application & Registration Packet

NEW STUDENT CHECKLIST

1. Complete Dual Credit **Application Packet** and bring to the Navarro College campus early in the summer. (*One time submission.*)
 - a. Navarro College Application
 - b. Final High School Transcript Request Form
2. Attach **official high school transcript** providing proof of residency
 - a. The transcript must show completion of the 10th grade
 - b. Placement test scores or proof of exemption are needed for Dual Core Curriculum course registration
3. Attach copy of **TAKS Score report** that you received with report card showing 10th grade TAKS scores if you will be a junior, and 11th grade TAKS scores if you will be a senior in Fall.
4. **Registration Form** for dual credit classes completed and signed by high school counselor:
 - a. Bring your completed Dual Credit Registration Form to Navarro College once you have received your TAKS scores from the high school. You may register during the SUMMER for fall classes.
 - b. Obtain a “Permit to Register” from the Navarro College business office.
 - c. Register with a Navarro College Academic Advisor.
 - d. Return to the business office to PAY your tuition and fees when applicable. *Payment can be made in the form of cash, credit card (Visa, MasterCard, or Discover) or check (requires TXDL# and DOB of the check writer).*

DUAL CREDIT – an opportunity for high school students to take college level core curriculum or career & technical courses for both high school and college credit.

Academic Core Curriculum – Associate in Science and Associate in Arts degrees require completing Core Curriculum courses including English, History, Government, and Math. AS & AA degrees prepare students for Bachelor degree programs. Tuition payment is required and purchasing textbooks may be necessary.

Career & Technical – Certificate programs and Associate in Applied Science degrees are comprised of Career & Technical courses. Certificates and AAS degrees prepare students for employment in business, industry, or health professions. Tuition is waived and a certificate major must be declared.
