

Navarro College RN Program

The RN Program is in Corsicana- however, general education courses may be taken at any campus
Most Freshmen RN classes are taught in Corsicana and most Sophomore RN classes are taught in Waxahachie
Clinical assignments may be up to 75 miles from Corsicana

- To count towards points, coursework must be complete and grades reported by the end of the fall semester
- Applicants **must** attend a MANDATORY information session (held October -January)
- Deadline for postmark or delivery of applications to the ADN program is March 1, 2010
- Start date for generic classes = Fall (late August) and for Bridge classes = late May
- Admission is based on a ranking score calculated by adding points from the following criteria:
 - 1) **Overall GPA must be at least a 3.0 for generic applicants for the initial offers of admission to the program; 2.5 for bridge (no points for GPA)**
 - 2) **Total Grade Points from General Education Courses on the Degree Plan (10 points)**
(1 point for each course and in the event of a tie, grades for each course will be counted on a point system)
 - BIOL 2401: Anatomy and Physiology I
 - BIOL 2402: Anatomy and Physiology II
 - BIOL 2420: Microbiology
 - MATH 1314: College Algebra
 - PSYC 2301: General Psychology
 - PSYC 2314: Lifespan Growth and Development
 - SPCH 1311 or 1315
 - ENGL 1301: Composition and Rhetoric
 - BIOL 1322: Nutrition and Diet Therapy
 - Fine Art/Humanities Elective- choose 1: ARTS 1301, MUSI 1306, PHIL 1301, PHIL 1304, Phil 2306
 - ORIN 1100- no points
 - 3) **Educational Background (0-10 points)**
 - a. Completed Bachelor's Degree or higher in a health care or science field (5 points)
 - b. Current Health Care Certification (Health Care Certification does not include CPR) includes: CNA, CMA, EMT, Pharmacy Tech, other (5 points)
 - 4) **County of Residency (0-5 points)**
 - Navarro County (5 points)
 - Service Area- Ellis, Freestone, Limestone, Leon (2 points)
 - Out of service area (0 points)
 - 5) **Points for grades in BIOL 2401, BIOL 2402, BIOL 2420 as follows:**
A=4, B=3, C=2, CLEP=3 (6-12 points possible)
 - 6) **Points for grade in MATH 1314: A=4, B=3, C=2, CLEP=3 (0-4 points)**
 - 7) **TEAS Test-** take early, save a copy of the results, score on this test is the most important when students are ranked
