



NAVARRO COLLEGE ASSOCIATE DEGREE NURSING PROGRAM (RN) STEPS TO ADMISSION FOR 2023

NAVARRO COLLEGE

STEP ONE: TO BECOME ELIGIBLE TO APPLY FOR 2023 ADN ADMISSION:

- Attend an Information Session (virtually or on campus) between Sept. 2022-January 2023
 - On-campus sessions: Sign In, Arrive on time. Latecomers (after 5min) will not be admitted.
 - Online Sessions: Must attend the entire session. Join meeting on time. Will not be allowed entry after attendance is taken (approximately 5 minutes after start time).
- Apply to Navarro College if you are not already a student here.
 - Make sure you are under the correct degree plan. Prior to acceptance to the program, you should be on: **Pre-Bachelor of Science in Nursing-A.S (AS.BDN)**

 - Send ALL **OFFICIAL** transcripts from EACH college/university attended, to NC Registrar/Admissions.

(ADN prerequisite courses **MUST** be completed before the application deadline).

Note: Anatomy courses taken more than 7 years prior to application deadline, will not be accepted.

- Take the TEAS test
 - Once you have achieved the required TEAS score, proceed to Step 2. You must achieve a total TEAS score of 66% or greater in order to be eligible for admission.
 - Students have two opportunities per application cycle (March 1, 2022-application deadline-January/February 2023) to achieve the required total TEAS score of 66%.

STEP TWO: APPLY FOR ADMISSION TO THE ADN PROGRAM

Mail or hand deliver a hard copy of the following documents:

1. ADN Application for Admission (located online; **MUST** be typed). **APPLICATION DEADLINES: LVN-RN Bridge= Jan. 13, 2023; Traditional RN= Feb. 3, 2023**
 - The ADN application is located on our website under the Program Documents tab on the left-hand side of your screen.
2. Transcripts from **EACH** college and/or university you have attended, including Navarro College (Unofficial transcripts are acceptable for the ADN application packet)
3. Your TEAS test results

4. A copy of your Academic Progress MUST be included with your ADN application for admission (Academic Progress can be obtained via the NC website under Self-Service--Academics--Progress). You must be under the correct degree plan. If you are not, contact Registrar's Office.
5. Proof of dose #1 and #2 of Hepatitis B vaccine (for vaccine that requires 3 doses at 0, 1, and 6 months).

STEP THREE: BEGIN GATHERING DOCUMENTATION REQUIRED FOR ADMISSION

Immediately begin working on completing the following immunization requirements and/or gathering documented proof of immunizations. If you are accepted to the ADN program, you will be required to provide proof of the following:

Must have documented proof of the following immunizations by the Program Orientation Day:

- A. Two immunizations for Measles/Mumps/Rubella (MMR), or a Positive Antibody Titer showing immunity to all three.
- B. Two immunizations for Varicella (Chickenpox), or a Positive Antibody Titer.
- C. Proof of one dose of Tdap– If no record then you will need to receive Tdap. If Tdap was administered > 10 years ago, you will need Td booster. Td booster is required every ten years thereafter.
- D. Proof of influenza vaccine received in fall 2022 (LVN-RN Bridge students only) Flu vaccine will be required for Traditional and LVN-RN Bridge students by October 1, 2023.
- E. Proof of COVID-19 vaccination: Most clinical sites are requiring students and faculty to be fully vaccinated for COVID-19. Proof of documentation must be received prior to attending clinical rotations. For LVN-RN Bridge students, clinical begins in June. For Traditional entry students, clinical begins in mid-September.

What Happens Next?

- Once you have completed Steps 1 & 2, the ADN program will submit your name to the Texas Board of Nursing (TX BON) as a qualified ADN applicant. The TX BON will submit your name to IdentoGO (fingerprinting agency). You should receive a link to register for fingerprints. **Do NOT register for fingerprints until you are offered admission to the ADN program.**
NOTE: LVN-RN Bridge applicants may not receive an email from IdentoGO to obtain fingerprints if prints have been taken in the past.

- Faculty will meet in February to rank all qualified applicants. Offers of admission will be sent out prior to April 1, 2023.
- If you are offered admission, your acceptance letter will include important information regarding important next steps:
 - Obtaining fingerprints (if applicable)
 - Submission of “Blue Card” or Operations Outcome Letter sent to you by the TX BON. You should receive one or the other, not both
 - Registering for drug screening
 - Providing proof of American Heart Association Basic Life Support (BLS) Provider CPR. (Do not complete this step before May 2023).
 - Proof of Tb skin test. (Do not complete this step before May 2023).
 - Information regarding MANDATORY program orientation (Bridge students= April 21, 2022; Traditional students= July 21, 2022)
 - Information regarding dates for clinical site orientations
 - Verification of Social Security card
 - Proof of Health Insurance
 - Copy of front and back of Driver’s License
 - Copy of Driver’s Insurance

What can I expect with the TEAS test?

The ATI TEAS (Test of Essential Academic Skills) is designed specifically to assess a student's preparedness entering the health science fields. Most likely, you’ve been asked to take the TEAS as part of your basic admissions requirements for nursing or allied health school. **Students applying for the Navarro College ADN program MUST score a Total TEAS Score of 66% or greater to be eligible for admission.*

Students may take the TEAS test twice during each application cycle- March 1, 2022 through Application deadline for 2023 admissions.
