



NAVARRO COLLEGE ASSOCIATE DEGREE NURSING PROGRAM (RN) GUIDE TO ADMISSION FOR 2022

NAVARRO COLLEGE

STEP ONE: TO BECOME ELIGIBLE TO APPLY FOR 2022 ADN ADMISSION:

- Attend/View an Information Session Presentation between Sept. 2021-January 2022
 - Face-to-face sessions: Sign In, Arrive on time. Latecomers (after 5min) will not be admitted.
 - Online Sessions: Must attend the entire session. Join meeting on time. Will not be allowed entry after attendance is taken (approximately 5 minutes after start time).
- Apply to Navarro College if you are not already a student here.
 - Make sure you are under the correct degree plan. Prior to acceptance to the program, you should be on: **Pre-Bachelor of Science in Nursing-A.S (AS.BDN)**

 - Send ALL **OFFICIAL** transcripts, from EACH college/university attended to NC Registrar/Admissions.

(ADN prerequisite courses **MUST** be completed before the application deadline).

Note: Science prerequisite courses taken more than 7 years prior to application deadline, will not be accepted.

- Take the TEAS test
 - Once you have achieved the required TEAS scores, proceed to Step 2. *Students must achieve minimum required TEAS scores in order to be eligible for admission. The ADN program uses ATI TEAS – National Percentile Ranking Mean Scores as the cut score for each subsection.
 - Only one TEAS score report will be accepted. TEAS scores cannot be combined from multiple reports.

STEP TWO: APPLY FOR ADMISSION TO THE ADN PROGRAM

Mail or hand deliver a hard copy of the following documents:

- ADN Application for Admission (located online; **MUST** be typed). **APPLICATION DEADLINES: LVN-RN Bridge= Jan. 14, 2022; Traditional RN= Feb. 4, 2022**
 - The ADN application is located on our website under the Application and Forms tab on the left hand side of your screen.
- Transcripts from **EACH** college and/or university you have attended, including Navarro College (Unofficial transcripts are acceptable for the ADN application packet)
- First page of TEAS test results

- A copy of your Academic Progress MUST be included (obtained via NC website under Self-Service-- Academics--Progress). You must be under the correct degree plan. If you are not, contact Registrar's Office.

STEP THREE: BEGIN GATHERING DOCUMENTATION REQUIRED FOR ADMISSION

Immediately begin working on completing the following immunization requirements and/or gathering documented proof of immunizations.

Mail or hand deliver copies to the same address listed above. Documentation is due on application deadline.

- A. Proof of hepB vaccine series, or a positive antibody titer. (Series takes 6 months so start NOW). **Must show completion of dose #1 & #2 by application deadline.** Dose #3 must be completed one week prior to program orientation day.

Proof of the following immunizations are due by the Program Orientation Day:

- B. Two immunizations for Measles/Mumps/Rubella (MMR), or a Positive Antibody Titer showing immunity to all three.
- C. Two immunizations for Varicella (Chickenpox), or a Positive Antibody Titer.
- D. Proof of one dose of Tdap– If no record then you will need to receive Tdap. If Tdap was administered > 10 years ago, you will need Td booster. Td booster is required every ten years thereafter.

Due by October 1:

- E. One Influenza injection to cover flu season then again fall of the admission year. (Will be repeated annually, in fall for clinical).
- F. Some clinical sites are requiring students and faculty to be fully vaccinated for COVID-19. Proof of documentation must be received prior to attending clinical rotations. For LVN-RN Bridge students, clinical begins in June. For Traditional entry students, clinical begins in mid-September.

What Happens Next?

- Once you have completed Steps 1 & 2, the ADN program will submit your name to the Texas Board of Nursing (TxBON) as a qualified applicant. The TxBON will submit

- your name to IdentoGO (fingerprinting agency). You should receive a link to register for fingerprints. **Do NOT register for fingerprints until you are offered admission.**
- Faculty will meet, in order to rank all qualified applicants. Offers of admission will be sent out by March 15, 2022.
 - Admission letters will include important information regarding important next steps which will include:
 - Registering for Fingerprints
 - Submission of “blue card” sent to you by the TxBON, or other required TxBON documentation
 - Registration for drug screening
 - Proof of American Heart Association Basic Life Support (BLS) Provider CPR. (Do not complete this step before May 2020).
 - Proof of Tb skin test. (Do not complete this step before May 2021).
 - Information regarding MANDATORY program orientation (Bridge students= April 22, 2022; Traditional students= July 22, 2022)
 - Information regarding dates for clinical site orientation
 - Verification of Social Security card
 - Proof of Health Insurance
 - Copy of front and back of Driver’s License
 - Copy of Driver’s Insurance

What can I expect with the TEAS test?

The ATI TEAS (Test of Essential Academic Skills) is designed specifically to assess a student's preparedness entering the health science fields. Most likely, you’ve been asked to take the TEAS as part of your basic admissions requirements for nursing or allied health school. That’s because studies show a consistent link between a student’s performance on the TEAS and future academic success. Link to TEAS test information: <http://atitesting.com/teas/teas-exam>

Students applying for the Navarro College ADN program MUST pass **Reading Comprehension with minimum of **72.8 points**, **Math** with **68.8 points**, and **Science** with **58 points**, to be eligible for admission.*

Students may take the TEAS test twice during each application cycle- March 1, 2021 through Application deadline for 2022 admission. Only one set of scores will be accepted.
