Reading Resources

Reading and text-to-speech applications can help students access course materials in alternative formats and support reading comprehension.

- **ClaroPDF** - ClaroPDF is an application for iOS that allows users to read, annotate, and edit Portable Document Format (PDF) files on a touchscreen device. Features include drawing tools, highlighting, sticky notes, text boxes, photo and audio integration, and webpage-to-PDF conversion. **Website:** [ClaroPDF](#)
- **NaturalReader** - NaturalReader is available for Windows, Mac, iOS, and Android devices. The application converts digital text into spoken audio. Users can import Word and PDF documents, adjust reading speed, select from multiple voices, and save content as MP3 files for listening on the go. **Website:** [NaturalReader](#)
- **Voice Dream Reader** - Voice Dream Reader is available for iOS and Android devices and converts written text into spoken audio. The application highlights text while reading, supports document imports, allows text customization, and includes a built-in web browser for accessing online content. **Website:** [Voice Dream Reader](#)
